ALC Forum Set to Challenge Governments to Deliver on Logistics Reforms

Senior leaders from across Australia's logistics industry will gather at Royal Randwick next week to call on governments to deliver on much needed logistics reforms to improve the efficiency of our national supply chains.

The [Australian Logistics Council Forum 2016](#) is being held on **Wednesday 2 March 2016 - Thursday 3 March 2016** at Royal Randwick, Sydney and will focus on the critical future infrastructure issues facing Australia.

"Infrastructure Australia's recently released [15-year Infrastructure Plan](#) will provide an important backdrop to the Forum as we discuss and debate Australia's Future Logistics Infrastructure requirements," said ALC Managing Director, Michael Kilgariff.

"The Plan lays out a positive pathway for reform, for example, its proposal to develop a National Freight and Supply Chain Strategy.

"ALC Forum delegates will send a strong message to Governments that delivery on this and other reform options, such as heavy vehicle road reform and freight corridor protection, is critical to improving the efficient delivery of freight around the country.

"Industry looks forward to working with governments to implement the reforms necessary to underpin improved productivity across our national and international supply chains," he said.

Topics to be discussed at the ALC Forum include:

- Preparing for growth at NSW's ports and intermodal terminals
- Role of Infrastructure Funds in the Australian logistics industry
- The Future of CBD Freight Delivery
- Delivery on Inland Rail

Mr Kilgariff said ALC Forum 2016 will have a particular focus on NSW freight efficiency, as well as the logistic infrastructure and policies required to meet a projected doubling of its freight task by 2030.

The outcomes and recommendations of ALC Forum 2016 will form the basis of ALC's policy dialogue with all political parties, particularly in the lead up to the 2016 federal election.
