National Freight and Supply Chain Strategy

- A 'white paper' for the logistics industry, to be developed by Infrastructure Australia, that should:
 1. map nationally significant supply chains
 2. evaluate the adequacy of the institutional frameworks
 3. map nationally significant supply chains
 4. identify the key bodies overseeing their efficient operation; and
 5. recommend reforms and investments to enable the more efficient movement of freight.





Why is this Important for Logan?

- Logan is uniquely situated at the centre of a major transport corridor, making it a significant link in Queensland's freight supply chain.
- Enhancing freight efficiency in this region is paramount...
 - ✓ Gross Regional Product \$10.345 billion
 - ✓ Population 308,681
 - ✓ Businesses 19,500
- Top five sectors are manufacturing, rental, hiring and real estate services, construction, retail & wholesale trade which contribute approximately 64% of the city's economic output.
